
The EB-5 Program has been in existence for twenty-five years and the Regional Center Pilot Program for more than twenty years. All of these benefits come without any cost to the American taxpayers and generate millions of dollars in state, local, and federal tax benefits.


H.R. 616 would make the Regional Center program permanent and help reform the underlying program to address national security, improve program integrity through thorough evaluation of business plans and econometric employment modeling, and get Americans to work on development and infrastructure projects.

We also include tough new language to address the recent concerns about perceived fraud and abuse in the program by adding provisions to ensure that safeguards are in place related to those who would attempt to misuse the program. H.R. 616 also adds important measures to strengthen the enforcement provisions of the law.
